#### CIL Grant form review and approval

The new CIL grant form for 24/25 was approved by Cllrs and will now be uploaded to the Parish Council website and promoted on social media.

#### CIL grant application – St Lawrence Church

The Parish Council had received an application for CIL funding from Barton St Lawrence Church for the widening of the Lynch Gate and extension of the parking area North West of the Church.

The aim of the project is to facilitate elderly and disabled access to the church and church services including weddings, funerals, baptisms as well as the regular services offered by St Lawrence.

At the time of the application being made the costs of the project were unknown so it was agreed to wait for the confirmation of the costs before the Cllrs were able to consider the application for funding.

The clerk will contact the applicant to inform them of the next steps required.

#### 4. Planning Applications & general planning/development issues

#### Cardwell Farm Phase 1 & 2

The Parish Council had been notified of the agreement of the street names associated with the development but no further details have been shared with when the development is likely to start. Cllr Parker would look to set up a meeting with Emery Planning to discuss the asks of the parish council around a potential MUGA or sports hall to be built on site.

#### JJ Sandhams

JJ Sandhams have agreed to an extension request with Wyre Council for the planning application submitted for a wider commercial development. A decision is therefore still pending.

#### • Development South of Station Lane

The site continues to progress. Barton Parish Council have written to LCC to ask that if possible the Parish Council be informed as soon as possible of any further works in the highway, relating to this development, that might result in temporary traffic lights. This would allow the Parish Council to communicate any potential disruption in advance.

#### Former Boars Head including PROW

Parishioners and the Parish Council had made representations to LCC and PCC regarding the reinstatement of a footpath through the Former Boards Head site now known as Boars Head Place. LCC and PCC have confirmed that they are still looking to progress this matter as the development continues.

An extension of the diversion order for the footpath was granted in January as the site is currently still under development and therefore not safe to progress through currently.

#### 5. Neighbourhood Plan update

The neighbourhood plan is now complete following a successful referendum and has been adopted by both Wyre Council and Preston Council for ongoing use.

Thank you to everyone who has played a part, however small, in the production of this very important document for Barton.

#### 8. Village Projects Update

 Barton Village Hall Solar Panel Application – The project is now complete and no further fudnign was required from the Parish Council following the full funding applied for from LEF being awarded to the Village Hall Trustees to carry out the project in full.

- Barton St Lawrence Church Bell Cllr Lees reported that the works are close to completion.
- Boars Head footpath & Interpretation Board no progress reported to date. To remain on agenda moving forward.
- Thorntrees footpath Cllr Parker to re-engage with contractors in Spring/summer with the support of the parish lengthsman and clerk.
- Coronation benches/seating area This project will be put on hold until a suitable central position in the village can be found for a seating area and bench.
- Telephone Mast at Barton Village Hall Project complete
- Parish Lengthsman update An update was provided at the meeting by Greg and included general litter picking, maintenance of PROW, erection of the Best Kept Village plaque at the village hall and planting up of the Parish Council tubs. It has now become unsafe for Greg to operate on the traffic islands to clean them so this has been reported to LCC along with a number of overgrown hedges and pavements.
- Upcoming events The Parish Council are looking to support future events at the village hall including a chocolate bingo and a Big Quiz following the success of both of these events held late last year.
- Forest Grove playground It was agreed to gather information on the issues around Forest
  Grove Playground and invite a resident to come along and talk through the issues at the
  March meeting so that the Cllrs could have more information to make an informed
  decision. The Clerk will obtain information from Rowland Homes and the Management
  company.
