Planning Updates

Parishioners will be aware that a number of planning applications have been submitted in the village to which the parish council has responded. Responses provided relate to the following applications:

Outline planning permission for up to 151no. dwellings and a community building with associated works (access applied for only), Wainhomes on land at Cardwell Farm, Garstang Road, Preston, Barton, PR3 5DR.

This application was refused at Preston City Council's Planning Committee earlier in the month.

The developer has since submitted an appeal to an original decision of refusal given in February. If you wish to make representations to the appeal inspector then the letter explaining how to do this is contained on the planning page of our website under 'Documents'.

Outline planning permission seeking approval for access only for up to 125no. dwellings (all other matters reserved), Story Homes on land to the north of Jepps Lane, Barton, Preston.

This application is pending a decision by Preston City Council and will be likely heard at a committee in December or January. 20/00907/FULMAJ | Erection of 39 no. dwellings with car parking, landscaping and all other associated works. | Land West Of Garstang Road Barton Preston

This application falls within Wyre Borough and relates to a parcel of land adjacent to Sandhams Cheese.

The site is already allocated for development within the Wyre Local Plan, although the application currently being considered presents a much denser of development of 39 affordable dwellings rather than the original 26 recommended for this site.
